What are they?

Glass crushers pulverize all types of glass to a non-sharp, sand-like, consistent sized, usable material which can be handled with no injury. They are a great way to recycle glass into a new useable product and they divert glass from your dump/landfill!

Uses for crushed glass

There are several things you can do with crushed glass. For example crushed glass can be used as:

Glas-sand

- Sandblasting
- Landfill cover
- Sand traps
- Beach sand
- Ice control (salt replacement)
- Sand bags for vehicle traction

Smaller glass crushers like this which process around 300-500 lbs/hr cost around \$11,000 (not including shipping).
