

FREON REMOVAL

We would like to know if you have any old unused refrigerator or freezer around. There is a person coming from Newtok to do a Freon removal. "Freon" is not a chemical per se, Freon is actually a trade name that describes a whole class of chemicals used as refrigeration. Most of chemicals included under the trade name of "Freon" are known as "chlorofluorocarbons". They are colorless, odorless, nonflammable, no corrosive gases or liquids. The most serious side effect of Freon exposure would occur at the time of initial exposure. People who have a history of heart problems should be very concerned about Freon because cardiac arrhythmia (irregular heartbeat), and palpitations at very high concentrations. For people who have a history of heart problems, being exposed too small amounts of Freon from leaking appliances should not pose any significant health risk. Freon is one of hazardous wastes at our dumpsite. Because of "chlorofluorocarbons" can endanger the ozone

layer of the entire planet. So, if you have an old freezer or refrigerator which do not work, just give us a call at 6529. QUYANA.




HUNTING

8. And extra clothing, Because the weather changes fast before you know it. These are things you might forget when you rush to go out hunting on a very nice day.






If you want to work. Come and see the bulletin board at I.R.A. office, there's:

The sea-wall project will start soon. It needs (1) Project Foreman- (1) Heavy Equipment Operator and (15) to (30) laborers and the days will be from Monday thru Saturday, 8 to 10 hours a day.

Boil Water Notice

The boil water alert is still in effect from the PHS water system. This is due to the test results that came positive for total coliform bacteria and E. Coli bacteria (anarrlug) on May 30th. This is probably due to the stray dogs and flush/haul system mishaps which couldn't be avoided. The Native Village of Tununak-IRA Council is trying to be in compliance with: Environmental Protection Agency, Alaska Dept. of Environmental Conservation, Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation and the Safe Drinking Water Act. There is an Administrative Order on Consent (AOC) in our Drinking Water System: the PHS water supply for the neglect of the compliancy in the previous years. This order was issued for the violations of the Long Term 1 (LT1) Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule. The penalty of the violations are very expensive. We hope to have this resolved ASAP as we wait for needed items and personnel from YKHC to arrive. We apologize for this inconvenience since it happened during the time when it is critically needed the most for the subsistence





SAFETY TIPS

EPA has found that children who breathe secondhand smoke are more likely to suffer from:

- Bronchitis and pneumonia
- Wheezing and coughing
- More ear infections
- More frequent and severe asthma attacks
 According to the National Cancer Institute,
 there are links between secondhand smoke and:
- Sudden Infant Death Syndrome [SIDS]
- New cases of childhood asthma
- Behavioral and cognitive problems in children. Breathing secondhand smoke can be harmful to your smoke-free home. Take the smoke-free seriously and protect your children from health risks of secondhand smoke.

- Choose not to smoke in your home and do not allow others to do so. Infants and toddlers are especially vulnerable to health risks from secondhand smoke.
- Do not allow childcare providers or others who work in your homes to smoke.
- Until you can quit, choose to smoke outside.
 Moving to another room or opening a window is not enough to protect your children.
